Church History (Credit 2 Hours)

Credit: 3 Semester Hours

Dates: September 10-October 22 (Sep. 10, 17, 24; Oct 1, 8, 15, 22)

Course Description:

This course will study first, God's Abrahamic covenant-promise as a means of understanding God's redemptive plan, his kingdom and the Messiah; second, the inauguration of the Messiah's kingdom, its principles and practices in the first century; and third, a study of the history of "Christendom" through the first four centuries of its existence. The third part of the study will emphasize some of the key doctrines and controversies —and some of the individuals who held them — that were at variance with Scripture. Principles at play in these centuries affected the much later development of both "reformation" and "restoration" history.
