

# ISAIAH

## Syllabus

### I. GENERAL INFORMATION.

- A. This course consists of 24 video lessons.
- B. Each class is approximately 38 minutes long.
- C. Instructor: C. M. Horner.

### II. DESCRIPTION AND PURPOSE.

- A. This is a detailed study of the book of Isaiah with emphasis on practical application.
- B. To understand the need for Jehovah, as a righteous God, to demand faith and obedience from mankind.
- C. To understand that Jehovah is active in ruling among the nations.
- D. To understand the relationship between the Old and New Testaments.
- E. To understand the “admonitions and learning” as presented in this book and how to apply that knowledge in today’s world.

### III. INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS.

- A. Required.
  - 1. Bible.
  - 2. 24 video lessons.
  - 3. Course notes.
- B. Optional: Any conservative commentary on Isaiah.

### IV. REQUIREMENTS.

- A. Read the entire text of Isaiah at least once.
- B. View all 24 video lessons in their entirety.
- C. Read the class notes in their entirety.

- D. Submit a term paper (explained below).
- E. Take two written tests.
- F. Have a combined grade average of at least 70.

**V. TESTS.**

- A. There are two written tests for Isaiah. The first test covers chapters 1-39 and the second is a comprehensive final exam covering the entire book.
- B. Tests may be downloaded at any time. You may use the test as a study guide while you are viewing the videos or for an extra challenge wait until you have completed the videos to download the test.
- C. However, when you take the tests you must do so completely from memory with no help from your Bible, notes, etc.
- D. You do not need a proctor when submitting any material for grading. God is your witness.

**VI. TERM PAPER.**

- A. Write a paper giving ten different lessons we can learn from the book of Isaiah. Cite Scripture references from Isaiah to support each lesson you draw.
- B. The paper must be a minimum of six pages, typed and double spaced. If handwritten the paper should be a minimum of eight pages, single spaced.
- C. The paper is due when submit your second test for grading.

**VII. GRADING.**

- A. Term paper and tests will be graded separately.
- B. Final grade is based on an average of all assigned work with the final test counting twice.
- C. You may request a grade be explained or reconsidered, but in any case the *WVBS Online Bible School* will have the final say.

**VIII. CREDIT.**

- A. Credit for this course will be issued, including a certificate, only after all assigned work has been successfully completed.
