
- What do we learn from the tabernacle/priestly system?
 - We learn WHERE Israel was to worship God.
 - We learn HOW Israel was to worship God.
 - We learn WHY Israel was to worship God.
 - We learn in WHAT WAY Israel was changed by their worship of God.




- We learn WHERE Israel was to worship God: The Tabernacle.
 - Directed by God according to a pattern (Ex 25.9).
 - Described as a "tent of meeting" (Ex 40.2, 5, Lev 17.4).
 - Anointed and thus holy (Ex 40.9, Lev 8.10, 15.31, 26.11).
 - Filled by the glory of the Lord (Ex 40.34ff)
 - Guided by the Lord (Ex 40.36, Num 1.50ff)




- We learn HOW Israel was to worship God: Through Sacrifices.
 - Sacrifice and tabernacle were inseparably linked (Josh 22.29).
 - Through sacrifice we learn:
 - God is holy.
 - We are not holy.
 - A price must be paid.




- We learn HOW Israel was to worship God: Through Sacrifices.
 - Through sacrifice we learn:
 - God sets the price.
 - God accepts the price.
 - God declares us holy.
 - God brings us into a communion/fellowship/covenant relationship.




- We learn WHY Israel was to worship God: Because God is holy.
 - Only God is holy/"glorious in holiness" (Ex 15.11)
 - Wherever God "is" is holy (Ex 3.5).
 - What God declares to be holy is holy ...
 - sabbath (days Ex 16.23, 20.8, 11)
 - nation (people Ex 19.6)
 - tabernacle (place Ex 26.33-34, 28.29, 35, 43)




- We learn WHY Israel was to worship God: Because God is holy.
 - What God declares to be holy is holy ...
 - garments (clothing Ex 28.4ff)
 - gifts (sacrifices Ex 28.38, 30.10, Lev 7.1)
 - everything about the tabernacle/sacrificial order was:
 - "holiness to the Lord" (Ex 39.30)
 - done "for I am the Lord your God"/"for I am holy" (Lev 11.44-45)




- We learn in WHAT WAY Israel was changed by their worship of God.
 - Because God was/is/remains holy, Israel must be holy too.
 - God's essential nature can be seen in God's word and works.
 - God created Israel physically in his image
 - God recreated Israel spiritually in his image ...
 - God did so in order for Israel to look like God ...




- We learn in WHAT WAY Israel was changed by their worship of God.

 - So that Israel would be God's continually.




- In what way does the tabernacle system relate to us today?

 - We learn in WHAT WAY WE are changed by our worship of God.




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
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
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
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
